### How to Propose Conference Sessions

Stephanie Bruffey of Oak Ridge National Laboratory is our Program Chair, and she welcomes your suggestions. Any member can propose, organize or chair a session at an ANS meeting, just follow the steps below. You have a great idea but don't want to chair the session? That's OK; we probably have another member willing to help out

- 1. <u>Write</u> a title and a 100-word description about the intended session/topic. Specify if it will be a panel or paper session.
- 2. Submit the summary at the Program

Committee meeting or send it to anyone on the leadership team to represent it for you. Sessions are decided on a year in advance. During the upcoming ANS National meeting, we will choose sessions for the 2020 National meeting.

3. Solicit experts to submit summaries by the deadline (usually about six months in advance) of the meeting in which the session will occur.

## Did you know?

Among the 15 ANS Divisions that proposed sessions at the 2018 Winter meeting in Orlando, FL, your FCWM Division offered 9 sessions and 28 papers.

Our last two national meetings were also very prolific: 10 sessions and 42 papers at the 2018 Annual meeting, 11 sessions and 31 papers at the 2017 Winter meeting.

## Treasurer's Report

The 2018 fourth quarter financials were received from ANS Headquarters. FCWMD fund balance is \$61479.

The upcoming major 2019 expenditures are:

- Navigating Nuclear support (formerly our Radwaste Magazine support)
- Congressional Fellow support
- Teacher Workshop support
- NEED Scholarship support

The first quarter FCWMD opted to add approximately \$650 to the Randall Scholarship to cover a shortfall in earnings. This is required at times when the three-year rolling average calculation includes a lower than expected investment percentage.

A draft 2020 budget will be submitted in September to ANS Headquarters.

The FCWMD financial health remains strong, thanks in part to the membership support of the topical meetings which we sponsor and co-sponsor.


## Membership
